The Green, Green Grass of Home

After a long, hard winter, lawn care season is here. Some reminders:

- Please respect your neighbors, and avoid mowing or leaf blowing at hours when others may be sleeping, particularly early in the morning.
- By city ordinance, all grass must be kept at a length of 8 inches or less.
- Excessive shrub or tree overgrowth interfering with the safe use of city streets is prohibited.
- Please dispose of clippings and yard waste properly. Pickups are scheduled every Monday, along with our regular garbage collection.
- Clippings / yard waste must be placed at the curb in an appropriate receptacle or compostable paper bag. Plastic garbage bags will not be picked up. Any limbs or branches must be bundled and cut to no more than 3 feet long.

Goodwill Store Rezoning

The proposed new Goodwill Thrift Store project continues to work its way through the zoning and design review process. Goodwill proposes to build a new store at the northeast corner of Shelbyville Road and Marshall Drive, replacing three existing apartment buildings. The front of the store would face east along Shelbyville Road, and there would be no street access from Marshall Drive.

Trash And Recycling

Beechwood Village enjoys a high level of service from our trash contractor, Waste Management. Trash is picked up on Monday mornings, and trash totes do not need to be moved to curb. Most large items will be picked up on the regular trash runs.

If your trash tote needs to be replaced, please contact Waste Management at (502) 228-0290. During weeks when Monday is a holiday (Memorial Day, Labor Day), trash collection will be on Tuesday.

We encourage residents to support our community by recycling appropriate items, rather than sending them to the landfill. Only about 30% of our residents recycle. Items that can be recycled include aluminum cans, steel and tin cans, aluminum foil and trays, milk and juice jugs, plastic household containers, glass bottles and jars, flattened cardboard, junk mail, plastic bottles, newspapers, magazines and phone books. Recycling totes should be placed at the curb for Monday pick up.

Summer is the time for outdoor adventure and recreation. As you're planning your outings, please keep in mind the parking of boats, trailers, buses, or recreational vehicles is not permitted on city streets. Such vehicles may be parked in driveways for up to seven days for the purposes of cleaning and maintenance. Otherwise, pleasure watercraft of 18 feet or less in length, if owned by the resident, may be stored indefinitely behind the rear building line of resident's property.

Our Fire Protection service is provided by St. Matthews Fire And Rescue. For non-emergency questions (fire safety, smoke alarms, etc.), call (502) 893-7825. For fire emergencies, dial 9-1-1.

Community policing in Beechwood Village is handled by the Graymoor-Devondale Police Department. For non-emergency questions or concerns, call (502) 327-COPS (2677). In any emergency situation, dial 9-1-1.

In the event of a medical emergency, always call 9-1-1 as quickly as possible.
